The main hall was dominated by two enormous tapestries & portraits of the Clifford family through whom we learned a great deal about their colourful history. The house has been in the family since 1564; we heard stories of how the Clifford's were involved in war, politics & religious controversies, tales of Clifford Castles, Clifford of the "CABAL", a secret treaty, a King's mistress, a Cardinal's daughter & tales of espionage, intrigue & bravery. Robert Adams & Capability Brown were commissioned to remodel the house, grounds & garden in the mid 18th century; I think that the Dining Room & the Chapel are absolute gems. We were also blessed on the day of our visit with blue skies & sunshine, in fact an excellent afternoon out for the members who came which culminated with a delicious tea in the Orangery.
