John looked at the coastline from a natural perspective & interrelated this with how generations have defended their coastlines over centuries; his talk was entitled 'Defence of the Realm-One Thousand years of Fortifications within south Devon" We were entertained to a fascinating journey through time when the defence of our South west coastal region has been vital to the security of our Nation. John gave us a detailed account of man made fortifications from Saxon headland hill forts to Norman crenelated Abbeys, Palaces & local Parish Churches in the South Hams & Torbay areas. Castles were built by the Normans to defend the rivers & estuaries of the South coast & later on Charles the 2nd built the Citadel in Plymouth as a permanent Garrison against later invasions from the sea.
